1 BUILDING MATERIALS

All the materials listed have been used to build Place Farm Barn and Courtyard. Keep looking and see if there are some more to add to the list.

2 PLANTERS

These were used for **ANIMAL FEED** and **WATER** in the past and have now been repurposed for plants.

3 METALWORK DECORATIONS

These are in the shape of **SEEDHEADS**.

The type of seedhead here is a poppy, but there are lots of other seedheads to see around the courtyard.

4 PLANT SUPPORTS

There are 2 of these plant supports in the courtyard, and they are called an OBELISK.

5 PLANTS FOR INSECTS

The colour of flowers you can see will depend on the season. Maybe there aren't any open today, but can you still see some of the seedheads from question 3? Insects are important to our gardens and the countryside for **BOTH** reasons listed.
